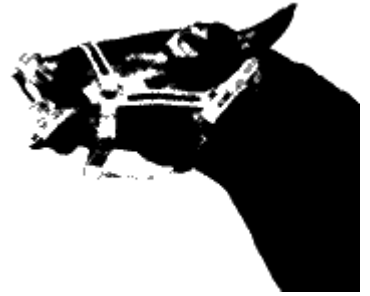

Fall Work Day and Vaccination Clinic

On Saturday, November 21st RBR will hold its Semi-Annual Work Day and Vaccination Clinic. We'll begin our work day at 8:00 am in the Clubhouse with a breakfast spread including fresh coffee. Jeff Powell, our Director of Grounds will have several projects, big and small, for us to work on. We'll stop around 1:00 pm to have lunch in the picnic area compliments of RBR. It's a good idea to bring gloves and some tools if you can. Remember to label anything you bring to ensure that you'll get it back!

- **If you can't make the work day you'll need to either send a donation to the P.O. Box or ask Jeff (rosebowlriders_info@yahoo.com) for a job to do on your own time.**

The vet clinic with Dr. Peralez will begin at 8:30 am by the Main Barn. RBR requires all horses boarded to be up to date on vaccinations *and* de-worming. Please be sure to sign your horse up by November 16th for the appropriate shots. **Most horses are due for Flu/Rhino and West Nile** but if you are not sure which shots your horse is due for, call the office at (626) 446-8911 and check.

Remember to bring your checkbooks! If you cannot attend please let me know so that I can be sure your horse gets the attention it needs. If your horse is on a different vaccination schedule, or you use a different vet, please let me know as well for our records. If your horse is due for teeth, sheath cleaning or further shots it will be added to the follow-up clinic with Dr. Peralez later in December and you will receive advance notice of the date and time.
